Prayer

Let's perform a test. Take three deep breaths and *hold the last one*. How long can you go without breathing?

- A few days? Of course not! Not even a few hours!
- The longest someone can go without air is a few minutes.



Prayer is as **essential** to our spiritual life as breathing is to our physical life. Without prayer, our Christian lives become spiritually stagnant. Why? Because prayer brings us into an encounter with the Living God!

1. Adoration

The word **Adoration** means to worship or praise.

"I [David] will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth."

Psalm 34:1, NKJV

David wrote most of the Psalms, and they are full of praise to God.

Praise Him according to His excellent greatness!"

List some "Mighty Acts" God has done for you.



and in Your hand it is to make great and to give strength to all. And now we thank You, our God, and praise Your glorious name."

2. Confession

Another important aspect of prayer is **Confession** of sin.

"If I had cherished sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened."
Psalm 66:18, NIV

"Cherish" means to treasure, love, or care deeply for something. To "cherish" a sin means that you are not willing to stop doing it.

❖ Underline what happens if we cherish sin in our hearts.
Sin damages our fellowship with God and keeps Him from listening to our prayers.

"Then I [David] acknowledged my sin to You and did not cover up my iniquity [sin]. I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the Lord.'
and You forgave the guilt of my sin." Psalm 32:5, NIV

- ❖ Circle what David "acknowledged" to God.
- **Underline** what God did for David.

"He who covers his sins will not prosper, but whoever confesses and forsakes them will have mercy." Proverbs 28:13, NKJV

- **Underline** what happens if we try to cover our sins.
- **Frame** what we receive if we confess and forsake sin.

- that I expect Him to give me that which I have asked.

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3. Thanksgiving

A third aspect of prayer is **Giving Thanks**.

"In everything give thanks;

for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

1 Thessalonians 5:18, NKJV

- **Circle** when we should "give thanks."
- **Underline** why we should "give thanks."



- ♦ It is not easy to "give thanks" about a difficult situation.

 Being grateful is a **choice** we make to obey God and be in His will.
- ♦ Gratefulness changes your perspective!

 Instead of focusing on your problem, you start noticing God's blessings.

"And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." Romans 8:28, NKJV

- **Circle** how *many* "things work together for good."
- **Underline** *whom* the verse is talking about.

Christians can be encouraged that God is able to use ALL things for good!

GIVING THANKS...

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- O demonstrates faith that *God is absolutely able to use everything for your benefit.*
- O helps you start seeing some "good" that **God is already bringing from a hardship.**

4. Supplication

Supplication is bringing our requests to God. Often, we become worried and forget the one Person who can help!

"Do not be anxious about anything,

but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Philippians 4:6-7, ESV

- **Frame** what we are *not* to be "anxious" about.
- **Circle** what we are to do with our "requests."
- **❖ Underline** the result of bringing our requests to God.

"Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." Hebrews 4:16, ESV

- **Circle** how we should approach God's "throne of grace."
- **❖ Underline** *two* things we will "receive."

God wants us to boldly share our needs with Him so He can help us.

♦ When we pray, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us according to the will of God.

God's Answers to Prayer

"When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures." James 4:3, NIV

- ❖ Circle why we sometimes don't receive our request.
- **Underline** what it means by "wrong motives."

If we don't receive what we want, it may mean we should re-evaluate our prayer request to see if it will *bring glory to God* or if it is a *wrong motive*.



"This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of Him."

1 John 5:14-15, NIV

Underline the condition for answered prayer.

God answers prayers with YES, NO, or WAIT.

- O If we ask for something *according to His will* (like someone to become a Christian), we can be *confident* God hears our prayers.
- O But we might have to WAIT until it is the right time for God to answer that prayer.
